down here by the bridge he will dig
for well water and Ira so it
will take some time even if they
have good weather all the time -

I am glad you are feeling so much
better. So bad the neuralgia don't leave
it probably will before long now -

you would be surprised to see how
nice that little buntie whitered out

I think you got the flammol very
cheap wish I could help make it up

I saw June over to Dexter she thinks
you might answer some of her cards
she is working in Durtins keeps
books I guess says she don't have to
work as hard as she did in the
buckery and gets more pay

she says they dont know what to do with Philis she feels so bad about her friend they have been going together for three years and been together almost every afternoon and cherishing the other. Small boy is sick in Boston threatened with typhoid fever

every body has troubles dont they - he was coming home this very week to go into business with his father

I didnt see very many people that I knew over there. Lizzie brought Buster up and he is very much at home. dont seem a bit home sick

Gramie haunt get home yet she is down to Ellas waiting for someone to come after her. I have been feeling awful miserable yesterday and today
